Report #1a Rules of Decorum **Enabling Motions:**

- 1. That these be the guidelines for the conducting of business at this meeting:
 - a. Out of courtesy, when Presbytery is debating, all remarks shall be addressed to the moderator and shall be made from the floor.
 - b. In the interest of time and to allow as many as possible to speak, speeches will be strictly limited to 2 minutes. Persons wishing to speak should move to the appropriate microphone. So there is clarity, a speaker should begin by saying, "I speak for (or against) the amendment..." The moderator will rotate between calling on a person in favor, and then a person opposed, etc.
 - c. Remarks shall be confined to the pending question. The moderator will interrupt if in his/her judgment the speaker has drifted from the pending question.
 - d. Commissioners may not refer adversely to prior acts of Presbytery not pending
 - e. Remarks shall not impugn another commissioner or that person's motives.
 - f. Distribution of reports or documents shall not be done during the meeting.
 - g. Commissioners shall not disturb the meeting, by applause or verbal response to remarks made by a commissioner, or in response to a vote.
 - h. Each commissioner may speak twice on a subject but may not speak the second time until everyone who wishes has spoken.

XII. 150th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

XIV. ANNOUNCEMENTS, CELEBRATIONS AND CONCERNS

Moderator Beck invited Moderator Elect Jane Stringfellow to moderate this portion of the meeting.

XV. COORDINATING TEAM

Coordinating Team Chair Maribeth Culpepper was not able to be present because of knee surgery. Nelson Capitan presented the CT report on behalf of Maribeth. Presbytery **APPROVED** the following Revised Proposed Covenant Presbyterian Church Overture to the Presbytery of Santa Fe

There are times in the life of the corporate church, as it seeks to follow the Great Ends of the Church, when (1) the proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind, (2) the promotion of social righteousness, and (3) the exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world call us to testify by speaking publicly. Beyond the venue of acting through a presbytery meeting, the Presbytery of Santa Fe therefore authorizes the Coordinating Team (CT) to speak on the presbytery's behalf without calling a presbytery meeting, with these stipulations:

A. If the Presbytery or a higher governing council has already made a statement on the issue at hand, and the CT's proclamation would be in keeping with those previous statements, a simple majority of CT could approve the drafting of a public position.

B. If there is no previous statement on a subject by the Presbytery or higher governing councils, it would require a 2/3 majority of CT to draft such a statement.

C. If a statement is drafted it should express theological imperatives of Reformed faith as expressed in Scripture and reflected in our confessions.

Once CT has approved the statement by the above stipulations, the Moderator and the Stated Clerk would be instructed and authorized to sign the statement on behalf of the Presbytery.

The Presbytery of Santa Fe is blessed with rich diversity – race, gender, abilities/limitations, ethnicity, age, theological conviction, and political persuasion. While we are one in Christ Jesus, we have a variety of characteristics, and a single statement issued by the presbytery may not reflect the convictions of all members or congregations. Accordingly, if the CT opts to issue a public statement, it will provide electronic notification to all members of the presbytery (including active and retired) Ministers of Word and Sacrament, moderators of session, and clerks of session at least 24 hours in advance of release of such a statement. Individual congregations in the presbytery or members of the presbytery may wish to make a simultaneous public statement. In such cases we would be openly affirming and validating our corporate diversity.

We acknowledge that individual congregations and/or Ministers of the Word and Sacrament may choose on occasion to make a public expression of their respective convictions, with Ministers of Word and Sacrament identifying themselves as ordained within the PCUSA.

Committee Members

There are six existing members of this committee: Marty Bruner, Lou Ann Johnson, Ginna Bairby, Maribeth Culpepper, Jane Moses and me, Ruth Montoya. (David Kirby relocated out of state in mid-year; two others resigned).

Scope of our Work:

Beginning in February, the committee met monthly to assure we had a complete slate of candidates for election at the 2018 fall meeting of the Presbytery. With support and suggestions from throughout the church, we were able to identify names of potential candidates who, in turn, agreed to place their name in nomination for various committees and commissions. We made a concerted effort to keep true to our Mission: "To assure that the Presbytery is served by the best and widest representation possible, while encouraging participation in the ministry, mission and work of the Presbytery by qualified persons from throughout the Presbytery."

Our Goals

In the process of preparing our final report, the CORP engaged in a discussion regarding the current composition of our committees/commissions, and determined that as we look to the future of our nominating process, it is imperative that we abide by our Mission (noted above). We observed that the statistical numbers indicate an existing imbalance on the various committees/commissions based on age, disabilities, ethnicity, theological frame of reference, gender, and sexual orientation. And lastly, a personal thanks to the members of the CORP who worked diligently to fulfill our tasks in preparation for this weekend. In the midst of grief experienced by Marty Bruner on the loss of her husband, and serious health issues affecting Maribeth Culpepper, whose faith, great spirit and sense of humor has been an inspiration to us as she continues to recover from her surgery.

Morning vespers were offered at 7:00 a.m. outside the Agape Center by MWS Ken Cuthbertson, Parish Associate at Las Placitas and HR.

The meeting was reconvened with prayer and gathering music at 9:00 a.m. in the Agape Center J. Herbert Nelson, Stated Clerk of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) was to address the Presbytery of Santa Fe this morning, but due to a family emergency had to leave. The Presbytery prayed for J. Herbert Nelson and his family.
